Such lively topics as \"How to Get a Free Lunch: Just Apply for It\"; \"Your Dog Owns Your House\"; \"Russia Hobbling Along on Clay Feet\"; \"Who Minds the Gap?\" and \"Free Riding on the Euro\" both entertain and instruct. The topical arrangement within the sequence of the seven parts of the text provides a meaningful context for the reader and allows information to be accessed in a

comprehensible manner. This book gives a jargon-free economic account of important matters in our daily lives. Its emphasis on the political rather than the ordinary business of life fills the need for revitalising classical political economy, concisely.
